Public Content

The City of Sterling desires to submit a grant application for the FY 25 Department of Transportations Better Utilizing Investments to Leverage Development (BUILD) Grant, formerly known as the Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) Grant Program to fund significant improvements to reconstruct significant portions of Griswold and Woodburn, adding curb and gutter (similar to the Dillon Avenue project) as well as add sidewalks to the neighborhood and a multi-use path to connect Scheid Park to LeFevre Road.

The City may qualify for 100% funding under the Rural portion of the application. Federal cost share may exceed 80% for projects that are rural, or located in an Area of Persistent Poverty (APP), or located in a Historically Disadvantaged Community (HDC). Depending on the project area, the City will commit to contribute up to 20% of the project cost if requested. The total project cost estimate is in excess of \$8 million. The City would provide any required match and any excess costs through its local option sales tax funds.
